Thank you for a successful Community Meeting on Saturday, May 20, 2017. We loved hearing your thoughts and ideas on **Public Facilities, Future Land Use and Sustainability and Resilience**.

Some of the comments mentioned at the meeting include:

- Provide recycling bins throughout Atlantic Avenue, especially Downtown.
- Place immediate focus on reclaimed water facilities, way-finding signs, and street flooding.
- Increase the City's Tree Canopy.
- Encourage uses on side streets along the railroad track (e.g. office, commercial, parking garages).
- Consider facilitating pop-up retail on empty lots (e.g. tents, pushcarts).
- Provide incentives or assistance to small businesses on Atlantic Avenue.

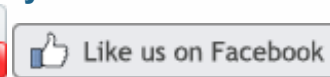
STAY CURRENT WITH CRITICAL INFORMATION REGARDING EMERGENCY SITUATIONS
